

# CAMPUS RESOURCES A-Z CHECK THEM OUT ON YOUR CAMPUS

**Academic Advisors** - guidance on specific degrees/programs and requirements, connect you to campus resources, answer your questions about majors and goals

**ADA Coordinator** – the college’s designated person to receive, investigate, and resolve any complaints of discrimination because of a disability, including lack of providing accommodations, in any college program, service, or activity, including classes, coursework, campus events and activities

**Admissions** - office for admission to campus and often set up tours and information sessions for interested future students

**BIT/CARE Team** (behavior intervention team) - address concerns for students experiencing problems or a crisis

**Bursar** (student billing office) – the office that sends students the bills for money they owe to the campus for tuition, fees, books, housing, dining, and any other campus fees (such as damage fees for damage sustained to the student’s campus dorm room)

**Campus Recreation** – department that provides recreational activities, usually physical activities such as gyms, tracks for running/walking, courts for basketball or volleyball, and may provide outdoor recreational activities as well such as camping, canoeing, kayaking, rock climbing

**Campus student newspaper** / campus radio or television station – students can get involved in reporting news relevant to students, the campus, and the community; opportunities to practice journalism and reporting (or behind the scenes editing and producing) as a student

**Career Center** – office on campus to help students develop career skills, including identifying career interests, developing resume, building interview skills; also works with off campus employers, develops career fairs

**Counseling Services** – mental health counseling services on campus

**Dean of Students / Vice President of Student Services** - student affairs/services professional who works with student offices and students to ensure students are included on campus and may reach out to students if there are any concerns about a student’s health/mental health or who is having a personal issue impacting academics (such as an emergency surgery)

**Deputy Title IX Coordinator** – the college’s Title IX contact person to receive, investigate, and adjudicate any complaints of discrimination based on gender or sexual assault / sexual harassment

**Honors Program** – program that invites qualified students (usually based on GPA and course load) to become a member, often provides “honor cords” to graduating students to identify their high academic achievement, may provide co-educational programming with speakers

**Housing & Dining Services** – campus office that coordinates campus housing (dormitories) for students to live in and provides the dining options for students (may include different types of cafeterias and dining plans); students may request accommodations for housing and dining as well as for classes

**Intermural / Intramurals** – recreation sports programming (teams based) that is either between campuses (intermural) or just between different teams in same sport on one campus (intramural), open to all students at the campus

**Job Fairs** – opportunity on campus for employers to connect with students and soon-to-be graduates

**Learning Center** – tutoring services, may include a writing center to help students develop writing skills for any type of class

**Library and Research Librarians** – resources for research papers; librarians are great resources for finding out more information or how to improve your research skills

**NCAA** (National Collegiate Athletic Association) or **NJCAA** (National Junior Collegiate Athletic Association) nationally competitive sports teams, usually limited to recruited athletes

**Ombudsman** - neutral person on campus who knows all the policies and can explain the policies to students who have concerns or complaints

**President's Office** (role of the president) – leads the institution; all campus vice-presidents report to the campus president; there may be a **Chancellor** who oversees several campus presidents for large multi-campus colleges

**Registrar** (registration and records) – transcripts, registration for classes

**Student Activities** and Campus Events / Student Organizations / Student Government – campus clubs and organizations students can be involved with

**Student Conduct Office** - office that responds to submitted complaints of student behavior, investigations, holds hearings, provides sanctions student must follow

**Student Employment** – students are hired by a college office to work for the office, usually on campus, may include student work study (a federal financial aid support for qualified students to work on campus)

**Student Financial Aid** - federal financial aid (FAFSA application) is managed by the Student Financial Aid office, sometimes scholarships are also managed by the financial aid office

**Student Opportunities for Research Offices** - opportunities for interested students to develop research studies in conjunction with faculty seeking students to become co-researchers

**TRIO** - TRIO includes eight academic support programs targeted to serve and assist low-income individuals, first-generation college students, and individuals with disabilities

**Vice President of Academic Affairs** - oversees all the academic programs and faculty, ensures academic integrity and accreditation standards of programs are met
